

Guna Nusa lowest bidder for Sidayu wellhead platforms

Guna Nusa (***PT. Gunanusa Utama Fabricators***) has clinched the EPCIC contract for Saka Energi's Sidayu gas development in Pangkah PSC in Madura Sea after submitting the lowest priced bid in the four-party tender.

The project has an engineering estimate of USD 30 million. The EPCIC contract will include two new wellhead platforms (WHP-C and WHP-D) plus two flowlines, with outer diameters of 12-inch and 6-inch. These are understood to consist of a production and a gas lift pipelines, with length of around 2 to 2.5 km each. Other scope involves the modification of existing WHP-B and AUP platforms for tie-in operation.

The EPCIC scope will cover detailed engineering, procurement, fabrication/construction, offshore installation, pre-commissioning/commissioning, start-up assistance for all the facilities in the contract. It is understood Guna Nusa is expected to utilise external support for the T&I (transportation and installation) portion of the EPCIC contract.

Sidayu is targeted for first production at some point in 2020. The field is located in shallow water of 15 m (49 ft), around 7 km north of the producing Ujung Pangkah field in Pangkah PSC.
